From the vicar's pen,

A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step—so runs the Chinese proverb. The journey of faith too must begin somewhere, a first step to be taken. We are still in the season of Easter. The resurrection of Jesus motivated those around him to take a step forward in faith, hope and joy. The proverb suggests that we don't have to try to get wherever we are going in a single leap. Step by step is fine. This is true for the journey of trust in God too. Sometimes a journey begins with a very humble, not so spectacular, first move; a stepping-out in faith, which may be following little more than a hunch, taking a bit of a punt, with only the haziest of ideas where this might lead.

Of course, first steps can be moments of great excitement and celebration. The first steps of an infant, the first steps into married life, the first steps into a new career. There is anxiety too—the infant may topple, the couple will face any number of challenges (for better, for worse), and you never quite know what a group of new colleagues will be like—but generally the motivation to step-out overcomes any fear. We are creatures who like to progress; to move forward.

Following the resurrection, the disciples of Jesus moved forward in their proclamation of the good news. They proclaimed that God in risen Jesus offers forgiveness for the past, new life in the present and hope for the future.

The biblical truth is before we take our first step, we are seen by God; we are noticed. The writer of the 139th psalm is overwhelmed with the thought—you have searched me out and known me; you discern my thoughts from afar; before I was knit together in my mother's womb you beheld me. This awakening to the idea of being seen, being noticed, awakened to the prevenient attention of God, is an extraordinary discovery in a culture that often pretend there is no God at all, and it prompts a step towards the one

who sees us; who bids us 'come and see.'

Easter is the greatest good news the world will every hear. Faith in God is a journey of joy, love and hope. God invites you and me to take the next step on the ladder, on the journey of faith; to come and see what the angels

see. You are very welcome to join us at church for worship any Sunday at 10 am.

Letter from Alex Jeffery HDC Councillor for Southwater South & Shipley Ward Does Millais going co-educational

really solve the Southwater Secondary School Crisis?

In March, parents across Southwater heard the news that from August 2026 Millais School will be going co-educational. Having worked closely with the Horsham & Southwater Schools Local Education (HASSLE) group I know many parents are welcoming this news, but is this the end of the saga? Horsham is one of the fastest-growing population centres in the South East with 13,500 unbuilt housing permissions already granted across the district. Due to our unique status of having to contend with Water Neutrality, the build-out rate across Southwater and the district has slowed.

However, this could all be about to change with the new Government indicating that they could scrap Water Neutrality legislation altogether to aid them in their ambition to build 1.5 million homes by the end of this Parliament. With the volume of unbuilt permissions already granted across Horsham coupled with the change in direction indicated by the Government, Millais going co-ed will act as a mere sticking plaster, papering over the cracks of a much wider issue which is the lack of investment in our local education provision. West Sussex County Council (WSCC) officers have already accepted that new schools need to be built across the district to accommodate the growing population that will come with these new developments. Long-term planning is required, something that West Sussex County Council and the Department of Education have historically failed on.

Two areas have been identified by WSCC as the most suitable areas for new schools with Southwater - the largest settlement in West Sussex currently without its own secondary school being one, with West of Ifield the other suitable site identified.

West Sussex County Council needs to work much more closely with The Department of Education and other stakeholders to deliver a long-term plan for education provision across Southwater and the wider district, to ensure that the future families of Southwater do not have to go through the stress and anxiety that the status quo has caused parents.

I believe that a repeat of what parents in Southwater have gone through over numerous years can be avoided for future generations with long-term plan-

ning and collaboration in the best interests of all residents. Upcoming District Councillor Surgery



Protect your home by protecting your garden

Here are some security tips to protect your outdoor space from opportunist burglars looking for a way in.

Let there be light - Consider installing security lights both to illuminate your garden and deter thieves. Motion sensor lights switch on when movement is detected, sodium tubes switch on automatically when it becomes dark.

Beautiful boundaries - Keep shrubs, bushes, hedges and plants cut back as they can provide a hiding place for thieves. Check that all boundary fences, walls and gates are in good repair. A solid barrier is an excellent deterrent to an opportunist thief.

Lock it up - Prevent burglars from breaking into your shed or outbuilding by using a good quality lock or padlock, consider covering windows with mesh and protect what's inside.

No Mow May

Leaving your grass to grow a little longer can have huge benefits to your environment and to wildlife. Even grass mown every four weeks will provide plants for pollinators. Less mowing encourages wildflowers to grow in your lawn and this is beneficial to pollinating insects such as hoverflies, bees and butterflies. Not only is this beneficial to your wildlife, it's easy on your muscles, too!

If you want to encourage wildflowers in your lawn, try No Mow May. As the name suggests, you simply stop mowing in early May, which allows the wild plants already in your lawn to grow up and flower, adding colour and attracting pollinating insects and other wildlife. You can leave your whole lawn uncut or just a section or mow pretty pathways through the long grass. At the end of May, consider leaving part, or all, of it unmown until August to encourage a greater diversity of plants. If you do go back to mowing, bear in mind that some wildlife may have moved into your wildlife haven so do it carefully!

Thinking of ditching the lawn?

Artificial grass seems like a trouble-free alternative to the real thing but there are some serious downsides to it, too. In these increasingly hot summers, plastic lawns can become very hot, the opposite of that cool feel of grass on your feet. It's unfriendly to wildlife; it can't be recycled and will end up in landfill; it's more likely to cause surface run off after significant rainfall which may contribute to flooding, the runoff can contain micro-plastics that will get into the waterways and it's not totally maintenance free. It still needs to be cleaned of litter and moss growth, potentially replacing mowing with vacuuming. Maybe your natural grass lawn has more to offer than you thought!

More About May

- Birds will be nesting this month so wait until later in the year before trimming your hedges.
- Tadpoles and newts should be growing up fast so if you have a pond, and are lucky enough to have any of these critters in there, leave a sloping side so they can get out when they're ready.
- Hoverfly larvae can be mistaken for pests and ladybird larvae look like minimonsters but both are garden friends that gobble up aphids so, if in doubt, don't squish.
- Buy local! May is the month for planting out when the last of the frosts is over. Locally grown plants by locally grown people can be found at the Plant Sale in the Village Hall on Monday 5th May from 10-12.00. Stay for a cuppa and a slice of cake!

Southwater Local History Group THE PEACE ROSE



Our local clay soil can be a pain but once it's been cultivated over time, it is particularly good for roses. If you happen to live in one of the older houses in the village, you may just have one particular rose growing quietly in a border and wondered what it's name is. If it has large light yellow to cream coloured flowers, slightly flushed at the petal edges with crimson-pink, it could well be "The Peace Rose". It's hardy, vigorous and resistant to disease, and it

has an interesting history too.

The Meilland Family is a multi-generational family of French rose breeders and their first rose specialist was Joseph Rambaux , who first started breeding roses in 1850 in Lyon. Since then the family has grown to become Meilland International.

The Meilland we are interested in was Francis Meilland, who developed the rose in question in 1935. It is a hybrid - Margaret McGredy crossed with an unnamed seedling - and he called it Madame A. Meilland. Francis feared, correctly, that the Germans would soon invade France and so he sent cuttings of his rose to friends in Italy, Turkey, Germany, and the United States to protect it. It has been told that it was sent to the US on the last plane available before the German invasion! Although the cultivar had different names in different countries, it eventually became known as Peace.

Early in 1945 Francis wrote to Field Marshal Alan Brooke, thanking him for his part in the liberation of France and asking if he might name the rose after him. Brooke declined, saying that though he was honoured to be asked, his name would soon be forgotten and a much better and more enduring name would be "Peace".

This name was agreed and was formally announced by the American company Conard Pyle, who introduced it in the US. By happy chance





this announcement was on 29 April 1945, the very day that Berlin fell. 1945 also saw the inaugural meeting of the United Nations, at which Peace roses were given to each of the delegations together with a note that read:

"We hope the 'Peace' rose will influence men's thoughts for everlasting world peace".

We continue to hope so indeed and maybe in this V E anniversary month, we could try planting some more of these very special symbols. They are still widely available and according to Newbridge Garden Centre web page - "Garden Centres are donating 100% of sale proceeds of the 'Peace' rose to the Red Cross Ukraine Crisis Appeal" so the rose continues to spread the message!

This May marks the 80th anniversary of VE Day and you will hear the church bell being rung at 6.30pm on the 8th of May to mark this special event. If we go back to May 1885 at the church vestry meeting it was reported that the running cost for the church in 1884 was £21-0-61/2 (RPI £2293.99). Also it was decided that, as Mr J Kilner the village sexton was retiring, the church will pay him a pension of £1 per year (RPI £109.08) for all his hard work. In May 1905 Miss L Stirling-Hamilton put on a concert at the school in aid of the Sunday School fund. Seats cost 2s-6d,1s and 6d (RPI £12.90,.£5.18 and £2.58), Southwater Cricket Club beat Partridge Green by 1 run. By May 1915 the village was asked to take part in the National Egg Collection for the war effort. Mr Booker at The Post Office received the eggs and forwarded them on free of charge. At their May meeting in 1925, the Village Hall Committee was told that the roof was now finished and the inside work was in hand. Of the £800 (RPI £41286.85) raised so far £774 (RPI £38396.77)

had been spent. Mr Walcott and Mr Warmen kindly gave a stove to heat the village hall.

At the 1945 May meeting of the Horsham Rural Council Housing and Drainage Committee it was decided to increase the rent on the 12 houses in Andrew Road by no more than 2s-6d (RPI 46p) per week. The Southwater home front applied for funding from the War Charities Act to support members of H M Forces, Merchant Navy and the Bevin Boys. The administration centre would be at the village hall. A bottle of Johnnie Walker whisky cost 25s6d (RPI £4.68) and ½ lb. of Brook Bond Tea cost 1s 6d (RPI 0.27p). For VE Day there was a bonfire and a dance held in the village hal. Knepp Castle put on a big dance, bonfire and fireworks but in Horsham it took the council two day to organise an official celebration.

Twenty years ago Southwater Amateur Dramatic Society and Southwater Village Hall Committee put on an afternoon show and tea party for the children of the village with the Lord Lieutenant of West Sussex as a special guest. The evening show for the rest of the village was called 'Wish Me Luck' based on Operation Pied Piper. It was supported by the National Lotterymto mark the 60th anniversary of VE and VJ Day


