From the vicar's pen,

May I begin by saying a big thank you to all who came and supported our Church Fair and Fun Dog Show on the 6th September.

On 5th October Sunday we will celebrate Harvest Festival at our 10 am service. The church will be open again from 3-5 pm for the village community to come and enjoy the Harvest Decorations. There will also be a service at 5.30 pm. To give thanks, we put things at the foot of the altar at harvest and in the foodbank box regularly to give to people who have no money for enough food, even their daily bread.

Jesus in the gospels talks about not worrying about what might happen. Look at the lilies, says Jesus. They don't spin or weave; they don't think about tomorrow; they're clothed and watered, God provides everything they need. But the point of this story is not really about abandoning responsibility in the hopes that someone else will take care of you; or about "eat, drink and be merry, for tomorrow we might die". It's more about trusting God because God looks after all creation on a daily basis. This is God's miracle.

I'm not someone who uses the word "miracle" very often...but when I see a tiny little tomato seed, I'm having faith that it will produce a 3 foot plant with edible fruits so long as we do our bit. This is all really up to God; and is, to me, a miracle of creation. Nothing we can do, apart from trying our best to take care of it, will make it germinate and grow and give us ... tomatoes.

We give thanks, we also share. There is the story about old lady who was very poor. She had nothing. No shelter, no food, no proper clothes. She prayed to God and God gave her 10 apples. This was wonderful. 'Now I can get the things I need,' she said. She was so hungry of course that she ate the first three apples and so was full. The next three apples she traded to rent some modest shelter so that she could be safe from the rain and the sun. She exchanged the next three apples for some new clothes, so she was no longer cold at night and would look smart during the day. But there was then one apple left over. 'Why did you give me one apple more than I needed?' she asked God. 'So you can have something with which to say thank-you to me,' replied God.

West Sussex Library Service Celebrates its Centenary

Libraries existed in West Sussex before the county Library Service was set up in 1925. In the early 1900s Marian Frost was a pioneering librarian at Worthing Library and



Museum and instrumental in persuading Andrew Carnegie to fund a new town library,

1925 13 February 2025 the West Sussex County Council adopted the Public Libraries Act. Henry Alan Twort was the first County Librarian from 1925 to 1937. At first it was just Henry choosing and delivering books in a Morris van. Within two years he had employed a small staff to help him.

50 centres were established in the first year, mostly in village halls and clubs. 108 library centres and branch libraries had opened by 1934.

1942 During World War II special library centres opened near local army and air force units, and land army hostels.

1957 The county's first purpose-built library opened in Horsham (see above) 1967 Chichester Library launched a computer controlled issue system – a first for a British public library. Once the system had been thoroughly tested it was extended to other West Sussex libraries.

1973 West Sussex Library Service unveiled a fully automated library so staff could bring up details of over 600,000 books at the touch of a button. In the late 1970s the punch coded cards were replaced by barcodes on library cards and books, with staff using a light pen to scan the barcode.

1974 As part of local government reorganisation, 12 libraries including Worthing, Burgess Hill and East Grinstead became part of West Sussex 1989 Library card holders could borrow video cassettes for the first time.

1998 Internet access was unveiled at Worthing Library.

2000 Library card holders could make their own reservations and renewals at viewpoint terminals.

2010 The first self service kiosks were installed. By 2011 all borrowers could issue and return books themselves.

2014 eBooks, eMagazines and eAudiobooks loans were introduced.

It was easy to imagine the need to save water when we were in the middle of a sweltering heatwave. No rain for weeks. Gardens turning brown. Pictures of dry, cracked reservoirs and talk of hosepipe bans. Wildfires on the increase. The new 'normal' looking worrying. Then at last the rain came, to the relief of us all, and with so many other worries in the world, we quickly start to forget about any water shortages.

But rain or no rain, here in Sussex we have an ongoing shortage of water and there's a regular struggle between developers and planners around balancing water conservation with providing much-needed housing. As individuals, we can't do much to refill reservoirs or influence planning battles, but we can try and do our bit to conserve the precious water we do have. Here are a few pointers:

Toilets use about 25% of household water and that's drinking quality water! Install a cistern water displacement device to reduce the amount of water your loo flushes. Consider upgrading your toilet to a dual-flush toilet, which typically uses 4-6 litres of water as opposed to the old style flush systems which use a massive 13 litres per flush (Taps&Toilets do these for a fixed fee: 07900 555819). Or simply check your loo isn't leaking by putting some food colouring in the cistern and if the water in the bowl changes colour (give it an hour or so), then you need to call a plumber! Consider a low-flow shower head and try to shorten your shower time. In the kitchen: Only run the dishwasher when it is full and avoid rinsing plates before putting them in there. That's the dishwasher's job! Full loads only for the washing machine, too.

We've all heard horror stories about fatburgs and some of the disgusting things that find their way into our rivers and the sea? On Saturday 11th October **Sustainable Southwater** will run its monthly stall from 10-12.00 in Lintot Square and this month the focus will be on the subject of what goes down the drain in support of **UNBLOCKTOBER!**

We will be joined by a team from **Southern Water** who told us:

"We are a small team in **Southern Water** that specialise and educate in Fat, Oils and Grease & Unflushables staying out of our drains to prevent sewer blockages and we will be providing some freebies such as Gunk Pots, Cheeky Wipes, Sink Strainers and Plate Scrapers to help protect our homes from blockages. Wet wipes (even 'flushable'), cotton buds, cotton pads, sanitary products and other various items all play a huge part in what we find daily blocking our drains – along with Fat, Oil and Grease being poured straight down the sinks causing nasty fatburgs."



Here's what has happened in the last month and what's to come!

- Update on Southwater Playing Fields Nomination Earlier this summer SPC had submitted an Asset of Community Value (ACV) nomination for Southwater Playing Fields (also known as Phillips Field). This was an important step in SPC's efforts to help preserve valuable green spaces for community use, particularly for sports and recreation. Unfortunately, the application to list the Playing Fields as an ACV has been rejected. The decision acknowledged the historic value of the Playing Fields to our community and used by Southwater Football Club, however the council concluded that since the Football Club's licence ended in April 2025 and the current landowner had indicated no intention to continue renting the land to be used for sport activities to anyone, there was uncertainty about whether the land could continue to fulfill its role in serving the community in that way. Whilst SPC are disappointed with the outcome, we want to reassure residents that this rejection does not prevent future applications for other areas where applicable: Southwater's community spaces continue to provide access to green areas that support recreation, sport and wellbeing and options to protect facilities for current and future generations will continue to be considered. - Millais School to Accept Boys from September 2026 The school will accept both boys and girls following a decision made by the Leader of West Sussex County Council. Making Millais School co-educational will address the issue of falling pupil numbers and help relieve some of the pressure for additional secondary school places across Horsham. For more information, go to www.westsussex.moderngov.co.uk and click on Decisions.
- SPC Latest Survey Details The results of the Grass Cutting and Ground Maintenance Survey for Southwater has been published on SPC's website. The Speed Limit Change Survey has also been shared and includes when the application was submitted. This is to support a proposal to reduce the speed limit from 40mph to 30mph on two key sections of Worthing Road at the northern and southern end of the village. There were almost 400 responses to the Survey with the majority of people in favour of the proposal. You can read the full details at www.southwater-pc.gov.uk/news.

Do you know where to recvcle vour They can be corks? deposited in the Church recycling Lane bin outside the Church Hall. Corks alona with spectacles, rubber gloves and ink cartridges to name a few items that can also be put in the recyling bin there.

Energy saving light bulbs last up to 12 times as long as traditional bulbs, providing the same light quality for much less energy. 80% of the energy used to power traditional bulbs is lost in heating energy, whereas LED light bulbs run at 80-90% efficiency.

- What Is Greenprint? It's an exciting three year project to test if grass cuttings collected from mowed verges can be converted into biofuels and a material called biochar, a carbon-rich substance that is like charcoal. West Sussex County Council are also measuring how changes to the way the grass is cut can give nature a boost, reduce greenhouse gas emissions and capture carbon in the ground. - Judicial Review Initiated by Horsham District Council HDC has formally initiated a judicial review challenge against the Secretary of State's decision to grant outline planning permsission for 800 homes at the Horsham Golf and Fitness site. SPC Planning Committee objected to the proposal and HDC originally refused the planning application on multiple grounds, including concerns over its unsustainable location and active travel options. 

Could Horsham's Local Plan Yet Be Salvaged?

Back in July, the Communities & Place Policy & Scrutiny Committee scrutinised the Cabinet recommendation to formally withdraw Horsham's draft local plan after the Inspector deemed that the plan would fail to provide enough housing for neighbouring authorities.

The scrutiny committee agreed to request that the council write to the Inspector to persuade him to reconsider what many considered to be the premature suspension of the hearings without providing the council with the opportunity to present sufficient evidence to support our plan.

This came in the wake of both Mid Sussex and Crawley Borough Council coming forward with an offer to present supporting evidence to demonstrate that Horsham has met its obligations to cooperate with neighbouring authorities, with Crawley's plan passing without issue. The argument that Horsham could have failed in its duty to cooperate with its neighbours without those neighbouring authorities also failing the same test simply did not stack up.

The Inspector has since responded and requested that supporting evidence be provided.

This is promising news, particularly for Southwater residents who have seen a sharp increase in speculative applications, including the controversial 800 home application at Denne Hill that was overturned by a Planning Inspector due to Horsham's lack of an up-to-date local plan.

Thanks to lobbying by myself and fellow local councillors, the council leadership have since decided to pursue a legal challenge against the Inspector's decision to overturn the council's refusal of the 800 home Horsham Golf & Fitness Village development which residents can expect to hear updates on as we progress through October and November.

I have also been making representations to the Planning Committee with speculative applications coming in thick and fast across Southwater including the latest application for 82 homes to extend Lindfield Close to which I spoke against, particularly in relation to the alarming noise assessment as well as highlighting the chronic lack of secondary school provision for the south of the village, a subject I recently wrote to West Sussex County Council about.

There is still a long road ahead before we will know whether the council has been successful in persuading the inspector to re-open the hearings. However, if he decides to do so, it is in the best interests of Southwa-

ter residents and the only mechanism currently available to us to prevent rampant, unsustainable development.

Southwater Community Police Office Looking Out for Each Other in Southwater

Marking your property is one of the simplest ways to protect your belongings and help police return them if stolen. Burglars are far less likely to take items that are clearly marked, as it makes them harder to sell on and easier to trace.

There are two main types of property marking:

- Permanent marking where you etch your street number and postcode or a customer ID from an approved database directly onto your items.
- Invisible marking, ideal for antiques or valuables where permanent etching might lower value.

More advanced is DNA forensic marking, which is almost invisible but highly effective- especially when combined with window stickers warning thieves that items have been marked.

Sussex Police also recommend using timer switches at home, locking doors and windows even when you're in and keeping valuables out of sight. For bikes, use a sturdy D-lock and store them securely.

You can also register your property for free at BikeRegister or Immobilise.

Sussex Police regularly run free bike-marking events locally. Follow their updates to stay informed.

Notes from the Past.... By Robert Piper

Now we have moved into autumn we look back to October 1875 when the village was told that the county had an outbreak of foot and mouth. in October 1895 it was decided that a working men's club would be formed at the school. It would meet every weekday from 6-10pm and be called Southwater Working Men Club and Reading Room. The club was open by Mr James Innes DL Sir William Stirling Hamilton gave the club seven guineas (RPI £840.54) towards the first year rent and the vicar said he would cover the first month's expenses.

In 1905 the church received a donation of £5 (RPI £528.76) to cover the cost of the organist salary, on the understanding that the village raise the same amount to pay for the upkeep of the choir. Sir Henry Aubrey Fletcher gave a donation of £10 (RPI £1057.51) to supply a new carpet in front of the church altar and new cassocks for the choir.

In 1915 the village sent sixty seven eggs to the national egg collection for wounded and church army at the 2nd Eastern General Hospital. The village also sent half a ton of vegetables to Horsham Hospital for wounded soldiers. The Rev Boyd was now on the front line working with the Red Cross and the RAMC.

On the 4th October 1945 Mr William Forlis former master at Christ Hospital School was killed outside the Hen and Chicken pub. He was in collision with a car. Miss Winifred Gunbrill of Cross Lane, Barns Green married Pte W A Brown of the Canadian army at Southwater Church

Southwater Local History Group Pumpkins v Mangel-wurzels!





Pumpkins, "trick or treat", fancy dress, you can't miss the fact that 31st October is now yet another major commercial opportunity! Every Halloween, the carved grotesque pumpkin lanterns scowl from doorsteps, lit from within by tea lights or torches.

Pumpkins have a rich and storied history, originating over 7,500 years ago in Central America. These versatile fruits were cultivated by ancient civilisations for their nutritional value, serving as a staple in the diets of indigenous peoples long before European explorers arrived.

Pumpkins were introduced to the UK relatively late, gaining popularity in the 19th century through Halloween traditions from Ireland and Scotland. The carving of Jack-o'-Lanterns, once done with turnips or mangel-wurzels, was adapted to pumpkins for their larger size.

Every year at this time, the glowing faces appear on doorsteps as the tradition of carving pumpkins commences. This tradition began in Ireland in response to a popular folktale about a man who carried a carved-out turnip filled with glowing coal with him in the afterlife. Irish immigrants introduced the custom to America, where the round orange pumpkins we use today are readily available, and the 'Jack-o'-lantern' was born. Now, since the 1990s, pumpkin carving for Halloween has become an increasingly popular activity across Britain.

Once your pumpkin has served this purpose, please dispose of it in your composter or in the household waste. Don't leave it out for wildlife – it's toxic to hedgehogs! Of course, you could always make a delicious soup with it!




