From the vicar's pen,

May I begin by indulging in a little reminiscence...The Coronation of King Charles the Third, in Westminster Abbey on the 6th of May 2023 included a few innovations, but was fundamentally true to the pattern of coronation services going back to at least the tenth century; ceremonies that have been handed from one generation to another, as a rich treasury of symbolic meaning.

To be frank, there were parts of that service that I never quite understood. There were swords, lots of swords. Swords were swapped and offered and redeemed. It was all quite strange. For many people watching the ceremony, I'm guessing that the swords were the least of it. Why on earth was the King surrounded by screens when he was anointed? Why was he anointed at all? Why did he change clothes, twice, and why did he seem to be, at one stage, wearing a large oven glove on his right hand?

The decision could have been made to simplify the ceremony and remove the most mystifying bits. But they didn't, and I for one am glad. I am glad they kept the long tradition of coronation services; with the whole of it, even the complicated and confusing bits. In the bible, 'Guard the good treasure entrusted to you', wrote St Paul to Timothy.

This month we have some important traditions and treasurers to guard. We begin the month with All Saints Sunday on the 2nd November. This is the Sunday we give thanks for all the saints who have gone to be with Christ before us. We also acknowledge that God looks at us as potential saints. On the 9th November, Remembrance Sunday we will have the Remembrance Service at Lintot Square at 10.50 am. 30th Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent. These are meaningful traditions and treasures to guard.

For St Paul, grace was given to us in Jesus Christ at Christmas. Jesus later abolished death and brought life and immortality to light. This, surely, is the 'good treasure' that Paul is referring to, and that we are called, like Timothy, to guard; even the subtle, difficult, sometimes confusing bits.

The treasure we are asked to guard is a revelation, not an argument, not a theory. The abolition of death, the bringing of light and immortality to light through the suffering and death of Jesus, the Son of God, is a gift, a given. May we guard all that is good this month but above all, in God, the hope of life now and eternally.

Less we forget

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the end of the second world war: a war that saw the loss of over 60 million people killed in just over five years. At Westminster Abby on the 8th May, VE Day ,the country gave thanks to the second world war generation who, both on the fighting front and on the home front, gave so much to protect our freedom and shared values. This was repeated on the 15th August at the National Arboretum to mark VJ Day. This year, when you purchase your poppy, remember that it is 110 year since the poem In Flanders Field was published in the Punch magazine. This started the sale of the poppies to mark remembrance in 1921 and raised £106000.

Every December the Phoenix Tree on the Hangman's Hill Roundabout becomes a living memorial to honour and remember loved ones who have passed away. Each bauble hung on the tree by volunteer elves carries a name, a message, or a memory, ensuring that loved ones are not forgotten but celebrated amidst the joy of the season.

And from deep in the seeds we concocted the essence of sleep and dreams and resting-in-peace. Almost weightless even in full bloom we made them souls, the poppies, souls of those who we lost, and - let it be said -

Poppies - nursed in darkness, nourished by dirt.

and papery petals - as easily smudged
as a butterfly wing they joggle into existence
again and again, unearthing themselves
in fallow fields and railway sidings,
on roundabouts, verges and no man's land,
from the brickwork of old chimneys and bridges

those who we killed.

They nod and they nag, reminding us not to forget, flagging a red alert as their crumpled petals unfold.

So, rightly, the poppies ask a great deal of the world.

Twenty five years ago, whilst much of the country was in a scramble to find the most extravagant way of marking the fin de siècle with Millenium Domes, Millenium Wheels, Bridges, Stadiums, etc. not to mention battling anxiety about the Millenium Bug, here in Southwater a calmer, more environmentally friendly approach was under way to mark the big event.



Led by Southwater Parish Council, it was decided that a Millenium Wood was the

perfect way to welcome in the new year, century and millenium. And so, on a cold, damp and muddy day, a small army of volunteers, kitted out in wellies and cheery grins, met at Stakers Lane near the skateboard park and planted a whole lot of trees.

Twenty five years later and those trees now resemble a mature wood, offering essential habitat for our wildlife and a place of beauty for us to appreciate and explore.

Conkers and Acorns can be Harmful to your Dog

Autumn is a wonderful time to take a stroll with your dog but some things like conkers and acorns, can cause them harm. Conkers fall from horse chestnut trees and can look like green or brown prickly balls when they are still in their shells, or smooth woody red/brown balls if they're not. Acorns fall from oak trees and look more like smooth brown shiny nuts, often with a woody cup on one end. This year there are lots of acorns around.

Conkers and acorns can become a choking hazard or cause blockages in your dog's gut. They're toxic for dogs and, if they are eaten or chewed, your dog could become seriously unwell. Possible symptoms include: Being sick - Upset stomach (diarrhoea) - Stomach pain - Restlessness Rash - Swelling around eyes & mouth - Not being able to move - collapsing.

Keep your dog on the lead where conkers and acorns are on the floor. If you're concerned that your dog might have chewed or eaten a conker or acorn - speak to a vet right away.

Love Food - Hate Waste

In the UK, approximately 9.5 million tonnes of food is wasted each year. This staggering amount not only represents a significant waste of resources but also contributes to environmental issues such as greenhouse gas emissions and water wastage.

Community Fridges are one solution to this issue, serving as a bridge between those with surplus food and those who wish to prevent fresh food from going to waste. They are run by community groups, in shared spaces such as schools and community centres, and they make the food they have rescued freely available to members of the public.

Community Fridge vs Food Bank – they're not the same

A community fridge is a space where A food bank provides short-term, includina fresh produce supermarkets, local businesses, and households

local people can share surplus food, crisis food support to individuals and from families in financial hardship

The primary goal of a community To receive food from a food bank, fridge is to reduce food waste and is available to all in the community

Community fridges are open to Food banks often have a cap on the everyone, with no restrictions on how number of visits a household can many times you can visit, and the food make within a certain period

Community fridges often offer fresh, good-quality food and operate on a perishable food items and may have trust basis without means testing

you typically need a voucher, which can be issued by calling a helpline

Food banks usually distribute nonset times for distribution

Housebuilding, Environmental Impact, and the Fight for Local Control

The recent legal challenge by Horsham District Council (HDC) has highlighted the growing tensions between local planning decisions and national housing targets. At the heart of the dispute is the controversial approval of 800 homes on unallocated land at Denne Hill, also known as Horsham Golf & Fitness Village. Despite the council's refusal to grant permission due to critical infrastructure shortfalls, including limited school and GP capacity and lack of sustainable transport links, The Planning Inspectorate overturned the decision. HDC launched a judicial review in August, arguing the Inspector had misapplied key elements of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), particularly those protecting local neighbourhood plans and planning policies.

While the High Court judge acknowledged significant errors in the Inspector's interpretation of the NPPF such as misunderstandings of paragraph 14b and incorrect assumptions about land supply—the case was ultimately deemed not strong enough to proceed. Importantly, the judge found no unlawful conduct in the overall planning balance, despite the Inspector prioritising housing supply over environmental and local policy concerns which is why HDC could not proceed to a full hearing.

This case underscores the environmental risks of rushed development. Sites like Denne Hill, not allocated for housing, face long-term impacts including landscape degradation, strain on local ecosystems, and unsustainable urban sprawl. The absence of adequate infrastructure only compounds these problems, threatening both the quality of life of residents within and surrounding the development as well as the environment.

Along with the Government's recent announcement of the removal of water neutrality legislation, this raises serious environmental concerns, particularly for protected habitats in the Arun Valley. Without requirements to offset increased water use, experts warn of long-term ecological harm.

HDC's response reflects growing frustration among local authorities who feel overridden by national targets specifically the Government's push to build 1.5 million homes before the next Parliament. Critics argue that in the rush to meet quotas, community voices and environmental safeguards are being ignored. As HDC prepares to submit a formal complaint against The Planning Inspectorate, this case serves as a stark example of the clash between local planning autonomy

and Central Government ambitions. If sustainable development is truly a priority, a more balanced and community-led approach is urgently needed.

Here's what has happened in the last month and what's to come!

- Southwater Parish Council welcomes New Councillors Following Full Council Meeting SPC held its Full Council Meeting on 17th September. This meeting marked an important moment for the parish as it welcomed new councillors filling three vacancies. Seven candidates put themselves forward to fill the three vacancies, each presenting their ideas, experiences and vision for Southwater. Following their presentations, an open ballot was held and the three successful candidates were co-opted onto the Council. We are delighted to welcome Cllr John Potts; Cllr Malcolm Brierley and Cllr Philippa French. With a full team of councillors now in place again, the Council is looking forward to working closely with the new members to support local initiatives, improve parish services and strengthen community engagement.
- YOUR COUNCILS ARE CHANGING Major changes are planned to councils across West Sussex. The Government has asked councils to explore how devolution and local government reorganisation could work in the area, with the aim of replacing the current county, district and borough councils with a new unitary council (or councils) responsible for local services.
- What is Devolution?- It is the transfer of powers and funding from national to local government.
- What is local Government Reorganisation? It is the creation
 of unitary authorities in place of district, borough and county
 council. It involves changing how local councils are structured
 and what they do.
- What could it mean for Southwater? There will be limited changes to the legal role of Town and Parish councils as part of local government reorganisation. However, with Horsham District Council ceasing to exist in April 2028, the ownership, management and care for many local assets in our Parish will inevitably change. At the stage of writing, it is uncertain who will be responsible for these assets or what level of service they will receive under the new unitary authority. Southwater Parish Council could step in to maintain a higher standard of services and ensure local spaces continue to be cared for at this level.

Doing so could mean an increase in the Parish precept, but importantly this would ensure that money raised from Southwater residents is spent directly in Southwater, rather than being absorbed across the wider unitary area. We are seeking residents' views and whether SPC should pursue their transfer from HDC so that decisions on their care and investment are made locally. - Worthing Road Speed Limit Reduction Southwater Parish Council has now submitted a
 Traffic Regulation Order request (TRO) to West Sussex County Council, reference WSCC747455903, seeking to reduce the existing 40mph speed limit at both the north and south
 ends of Worthing Road. The Worthing Road Speed Limit Survey results, with over 400
 responses show strong resident support for the proposed reduction. The purpose of the
 request is to enhance safety for everyone. The proposal is supported by County Cllr Nigel
 Jupp, Southwater Parish Council, and all three local schools. Visit our website for more

- Formal complaint Submitted to The Planning Inspectorate SPC submitted a formal complaint to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) on 3rd October 2025 regarding the Inspector's decision to uphold the appeal for up to 800 dwellings at Horsham Golf & Fitness. The complaint focuses on the fact that the Inspector re-examined whether the "made" Neighbourhood Plan (approved by referendum in 2021) had allocated enough housing using today's figures and methodologies. This was not within their remit: the Plan had already been properly examined and adopted under the requirements at the time. By taking this approach, the Inspector wrongly concluded that the Plan was "out of date". Horsham District Council also had their judicial review on this rejected by the High Court. Their challenge was based on two key areas where they were of the view the appointed inspector had failed to apply the law correctly and HDC will also be making a formal complaint to the Planning Inspectorate.

Bonfire Night, celebrated every 5th November, marks the anniversary of the failed Gunpowder Plot of 1605, when Guy Fawkes and his conspirators tried to blow up the Houses of Parliament. The discovery of the plot led to annual bonfires across Britain in celebration of the King's safety, a tradition that still lights up our skies more than 400 years later.

Here in Southwater and across Sussex, families and friends will gather once again to enjoy fireworks, sparklers and the warmth of a bonfire. To keep the evening safe for everyone, residents are encouraged to visit organised displays where possible. If you're hosting at home, keep children and pets at a safe distance, avoid loose clothing near flames, and store fireworks securely in a closed metal box.

Remember, sparklers burn at around $1,600\,^{\circ}\text{C}$ — $16\,\text{times}$ hotter than boiling water. Always hold them at arm's length, wear gloves and place used ones in a bucket of water.

Let's keep this much-loved tradition safe, considerate and enjoyable for all, one spark at a time.



Southwater Local History Group Mary Wheatland – Bognor's Mermaid



Born Mary Norris in 1835 in Aldingbourne, at 14 she moved to Bognor (before it was Regis!) to work for a Mrs Mills,



proprietress of the local bathing machines. Although initially employed as a domestic servant, Mary was soon promoted to help run the bathing machines.

Not all bathers were swimmers and Mary, who was a very strong and powerful swimmer, was in her element. The heavy, skirted costumes of the day did not stop her; she

learned to dive off the pier and for amusement would often dive underwater, stand on her head and wave her legs in the air! It seems she continued to do this well into her old age.

During her very first year, aged 16, she made her first rescue, saving a French lady who was drifting out to sea. Even in the roughest seas, she would swim out undeterred and bring the endangered people safely back. She married George Wheatland in 1857 and they raised a large family. Mary, a great multi-tasker, combined motherhood and beach work, eventually going into business for herself with her own bathing machines and also giving swimming lessons to visitors and local private girls schools, probably a first for a woman. In 1897, George died, leaving her the sole breadwinner for the family.

A well known and popular figure, she was also known for being kind, brave and modest. One of her rescues had been that of a group of six "giddy young girls" who were, according to an onlooker, "all drowning together in a bunch". Mary, at great risk to herself, swam round behind them and herded them all back to shore. When being interviewed later, she said "Pray don't say anything about it for they were very good to me; they gave me £2 towards back rent and a bit of beef at Christmas". It was said that she thought saving lives was as much her work as rinsing out bathing costumes.

She was awarded two certificates and a gold and a silver medal by the National Humane Society and Viscount Fitz-Alan presented her with a Golden

Penny for the rescue of the six girls.

Photos of her with her medals were turned into postcards, inscribed with the words "A little old woman stands on the parade at Bognor looking out to sea. She is clad in a blue serge costume on the bodice of which two life-saving medals are pinned. A battered sailor hat, bearing her name in gold letters, is tied under her chin with black ribbons. The weather-beaten face is crumpled into a network of smiles"

She finally retired in 1909 and continued living at South Bersted, Bognor, until her death at the age of 89 in 1924. It is reported that she was deeply mourned and local fishermen carried her coffin to St Mary Magdalene Parish Church where she is buried and where there is a memorial bench dedicated to this wonderful local hero.

Think of her next time you see the Lifeguards continuing her tradition and keeping our beaches safe.

Church Room installs air-to-air heat pump

The Southwater Church Room underwent a major transformation over the summer holidays. Not only have we installed double glazing but the old night storage heaters have been replaced by a state of the art, eco-friendly, fully controllable air-to- air heat pump. Our hall is now warmer and cosier in winter and the warmth extends to our kitchen and toiletsand in summer, when you think it is too warm to exercise, we can reverse the system and cool you down.

There are many people to thank for making all this possible but top of the list must be Nick Owens of Owens Insight and HKD Energy Ltd, the Community Benefit Society that he chairs. Nick advised us on the most cost effective ways of keeping our building warm while reducing our energy consumption and carbon emissions. We were given several options including solar panels and better insulation but the two unquestionable winners for us were double glazing and the air-to air heat pump.

We commissioned the double glazing - our thanks to local supplier Mark Antony Windows who completed the installation on time and within budget - and the directors of HKD Energy who unbelievably funded the air to air heat pump which fell within their social enterprise remit of developing renewable energy projects in and around West Sussex. Steve Alcock of SA Technical Systems, a local supplier of renewable heating and air conditioning, installed the system. Again on time and within budget.

Our heartfelt thanks to HKD Energy for enabling us to complete the whole project so quickly. We are so grateful to you and will enjoy the benefits for many years to come.




