From the vicar's pen,

Lent begins on the 5th March, Ash Wednesday which is a journey that culminates on Easter Sunday. The apostle Thomas is often known for his doubt about Jesus' resurrection. However, his story is one of transformation—from doubt to faith. Do you have a faith? What do you think about Easter? What is the relevance of Easter faith today?

Thomas, upon hearing the news of Christ's resurrection, expressed doubt, insisting that he needed to see and touch Jesus's wounds to believe. This reveals a human struggle – needing physical evidence to believe in the supernatural. Jesus, in His compassion, appeared to Thomas, inviting him to see and touch His wounds. This personal encounter with the risen Christ is what brought transformation in Thomas's life.

Nonetheless, Jesus commends those who believe without seeing. This affirms the essence of faith – believing without seeing, as echoed in 2 Corinthians 5:7, "For we live by faith, not by sight."

The story of Thomas's journey from doubt to belief offers valuable lessons for us all. It highlights that doubts, when brought before God in prayer, can be transformed into faith. Thomas's life encourages us to believe in Christ's resurrection and His promises, regardless of what we see. This inspires us to live by faith, not by sight, trusting in the character and promises of God even in the midst of uncertainty.

The Holy Innocents Parish church, Southwater will be running an Alpha course, from May, for those who would like to explore faith in God. "The Alpha Course is created to outline the core principles of the Christian faith. ….. By focusing on the fundamentals of Christianity, it opens the door for Alpha to be used in almost any context so that everyone can engage in discussions and be transformed by the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

Alpha is organised as a series of sessions over 10 weeks, including a day or weekend away. Each session has a talk and then discussion in small groups. The talks aim to cover the basic beliefs of the Christian faith.

Alpha is now used in various churches around the world. Its supporters include many Catholic cardinals, Anglican archbishops and bishops, and leading figures of all denominations. Former Archbishop of Canterbury, George Carey described the course as "superb." More details about the

course can be found elsewhere in the magazine (pp32-33). Faith in God is liberating as it teaches you that you are never alone and gives you an eternal perspective.

Letter from Alex Jeffery.

HDC Councillor for Southwater South & Shipley Ward

On the 5th of February, we learned that County Council elections across West Sussex and 9 other authorities had been cancelled by the Government after these authorities were successful in their application to join the 'Devolution Priority Programme'. While the concept of devolution had been discussed before the Government announcement in December 2024 – the Labour manifesto did not include this 'rapid' widespread local government reorganisation.

The reality is Horsham District Council (HDC) and West Sussex County Council (WSCC) will cease to exist, with services provided by both, absorbed into a new larger Strategic Authority of around 1.7million residents - headed by an elected Mayor of Sussex. Proposals include three unitary councils, under the Strategic Authority, with our area's services supplied by one of these. HDC had limited sight of these proposals, with East & West Sussex County Councils & Brighton & Hove City Council applying to the Government to join the programme. HDC has been given 6 weeks to submit an initial proposal for reorganisation. This is the largest local government reorganisation in our area, since the formation of the current structure in the mid-1970s.

Opinion Piece

While some argue that one-tier systems are more efficient, I have several concerns regarding the proposals:

- Less local representation with fewer councillors representing residents and handling casework on their behalf.
- The potential loss of 'non-statutory' services provided by the district council services the council is not legally obliged to provide e.g. grants for community projects, Horsham Lates, and The Capitol Theatre.
- Impact on essential services during a 'rushed reorganisation' why the hurry?
- No public mandate for these changes.

HDC is a well-run district council serving the residents of Horsham District. Other nearby councils such as Woking and Brighton have risked taxpayers' money, incurring large losses, resulting in the reduction of services. Without a 'settlement', it is difficult to see how any new unitary council could continue to provide local non-statutory services including Leisure, The Arts, Parks & Countryside etc. There is limited information on how the Government will address these concerns. I will look to update residents as and when we know more.

- The Big Southwater Bin Survey Community Consultation -SPC has launched community consultations and is committed to engaging with residents and ensuring that local voices shape the future of its community. Throughout the year, it will be running a series of short online consultations on various topics. allowing residents to share their opinions and help guide decisions on local matters. The first consultation focuses on public bins across Southwater, covering everything from general waste bins to recycling and dog waste bins. They want to hear your thoughts on their locations, types, and whether there are enough to meet the needs of our community. These surveys are designed to be quick and easy to complete, ensuring that everyone has a chance to contribute without taking up too much time. - Southwater Parish Council (SPC) Budget and Precept for 2025-26 SPC approved the budget for financial year 1st April 2025 to 31st March 2026 at the Full Council Meeting of 15th January 2025. This represented a total precept reuirement of £542,528, resulting in Band D Council Tax of £117.37. This equates to an increase of 46 pence per month to a Band D Household. Love Food - Hate Waste

In the UK, approximately 9.5 million tonnes of food is wasted each year. This staggering amount not only represents a significant waste of resources but also contributes to environmental issues such as greenhouse gas emissions and water wastage.

Community Fridges have emerged as one particular solution to this issue, serving as a bridge between those with surplus food and those who wish to prevent fresh food from going to waste. They are run by community groups, in shared spaces such as schools and community centres, and they make the food they have rescued freely available to members of the public.

Community Fridge vs Food Bank

A community fridge is a space where A food bank provides short-term, crisis local people can share surplus food. food support to individuals and families fresh produce includina supermarkets, local businesses, and households

The primary goal of a community fridge is to reduce food waste and is available to all in the community

Community fridges are open to everyone, with no restrictions on how many times you can visit, and the food is free

Community fridges often offer fresh, good-quality food and operate on a trust perishable food items and may have basis without means testing

from in financial hardship

To receive food from a food bank, you typically need a voucher, which can be issued by calling a helpline

Food banks often have a cap on the number of visits a household can make within a certain period

Food banks usually distribute nonset times for distribution



Making Sustainable Food Choices

Two national campaigns this month help us to focus on how to reduce our food waste: Cultivation Street (cultivationstreet.com/) which celebrates community gardening, and Food Waste Action Week from Love Food Hate Waste (lovefoodhatewaste.com).

Did you know that a shocking 40+% of our household waste in Horsham District is food, and salad and fresh vegetables make up 27% of our food waste! This is bad for the environment whilst a recent report by WRAP estimates the average family loses around £80 per month on food nationally.

From buying loose fruit and veg, through to freezing leftovers, growing your own salads, or visiting your local Community Larder, there are many ways to think about how to buy wisely and reduce food waste. You can also share the food you won't use, such as through the Olio App (olioapp.com/en).

From 10am-4pm on Saturday 26th April, Horsham will come alive to celebrate green living in Sussex – perfect for mums, dads, and little ones alike. It's a day packed with local food, expert talks and eco-friendly fun that will inspire you and your family to live more sustainably.

Spread across four unique venues in central Horsham, come along for a day of free goodies, family-friendly activities, and caring community vibes at the Plant to Plate Festival!

At the Sussex Green Hub, in the United Reformed Church, you will find advice and simple energy-saving hacks to reduce utility bills, our popular Horsham Repair Café who might help you fix that zip, clock or kettle. There will be free food stalls at the Horsham Community Fridge, our Refill Shop to top up on all of the essentials, and don't forget to treat yourself to one of the Sussex food or drink artisan delights – of course all in line with reducing waste.

At the Unitarian Church Hall and gardens, green thumbs can get handson gardening tips from the experts with activities like 'take it away' seedlings, books and goodie stall and ways to reduce your food waste. There's also the chance to get your hands dirty with composting and wildlife-friendly gardening advice and nature activities for the kids. The Quaker Meeting House will play host to an array of expert talks and demonstrations, including how to avoid that problematic packaging that just can't be recycled and ideas on how to cook tasty healthy meals that can reduce your impact on the planet.

Stop off at the Bishopric Market on your way between the venues, hosting fresh fruit, veggies, plants, and even retro pre-loved treasures for your home. 

My Garden Birds

We all like to see birds on our walks or from our windows. Over nearly 20 years I have been systematically recording what birds fly by, who comes to a feeder or who takes a bath. Looking at the data I can say 976 records were noted, for the British Trust for Ornithology, Garden BirdWatch in 2024. Why do this? It helps us understand more about how bird populations use garden habitats. My garden has grass, fruit trees, hedges, mature native species of trees and importantly a bird bath, a small pond and wild areas. I follow a 'no-mow-May' policy for most of the grassed areas, which I extend to September for the benefit of butterflies and insects.

Records show I recorded 40 different species. Most recorded bird species were Blue Tit and Robin, recorded in every week. The top weeks in 2024 were weeks in January, February (with winter migrants) and June when I reported 20 species of wildlife that is birds and butterflies.

Records of other wildlife see the importance of garden spaces for wildlife more broadly. In 2024 I submitted records for 36 species of wildlife other than birds, for example Grass Snake, Slow-worm, Frog, Fox, bats and many butterflies.

An analysis shows that compared to other rural gardens in Southeast England, my record of 40 bird species puts the garden in the top 30% of gardens in terms of bird diversity. Some notable sightings in 2024 were: Siskin, Kestrel, Lesser Whitethroat, Marsh Tit and Buzzard.

Each year of data is incredibly valuable to the BTO, and reveals how garden bird populations are changing over time. As a new year launches I'm excited to see a pair of Stock Doves prospecting at a nesting box put up two years ago. What will you see today? Marlpost Birder - More information at www.bto.org












Southwater Local History Group - Dino Discoveries

It's quite difficult to imagine a time when Southwater was a tropical swamp with dinosaurs plodding about the Country Park and the Sports Club. However, as we know, there were certainly iguanodons in the district and bones were found in the clay pits which form the Country






Park Lake!

We now have the excellent sculpture in Lintot Square, made by Hannah Stewart and fondly known as Iggy. It's a particular favourite with the local children who like to visit it after school, patting it's nose and clambering on it's back.

This wasn't the first attempt at depicting it, however. The Building Trades Exhibition was held annually at Olympia in West Kensington from 1924 until 1957 and the Sussex Brick Company were regular exhibitors. In 1932, their exhibit took the form of a very strange construction, described as "a cross between an Iguanodon and tank and making a striking spearhead to a row of brick stands just within the main entrance."

A rather less flattering view was that of "Impressions of an Impartial Observer" "The pavilion erected by this firm was designed to resemble the Iguanodon which countless thousands of years ago inhabited

the Weald of Sussex. It is well that such a monster has long been extinct, but I cannot reconcile the portrayal of it in a more recent and far more lasting material with the use of clay to produce the assumed likeness. Artistic it could not be called, nor illustrative of the use and value of the Wealden beds, contemporaneous with the formation of which it appears to have lived. The firm is one of such importance, and produces such excellent quality goods that it can afford to father a joke on the serious and preoccupied architect, surveyor or builder. As an onlooker, it made me shudder, rather." We think it looks rather jolly!

Spring has sprung and the daffodils are in full flower. March is a quiet month in the village. In March 1885 it was reported that the concert at the school raised £8-10-6 (RPI £928.88) for the choir fund. There was also sad news of the death of Mr Charman of Great House Farm who, aged 76, was one of the oldest residents of the village. In March 1915 the paper reported that Kings Farm was to be sold by auction as part of the late Mr C C Eversfied Esq of Denne Parks estate. Mr Booker and his wife from the Post Office thanked all subscribers for the new roll top desk which was bought for their wedding present. It can be seen at the Post Office.

In March 1945 three members of Southwater WI agreed to take in three refugee children from The Netherland for two weeks. There was a lady's BSA Cycle for sale in Shipley Road for £5 (RPI £183.09), a wash house man was wanted from mid-April at Christ Hospital school, Staker Farm had one ton of swedes for sale and a whist drive was to be held on the 2nd April at the Village Hall, admission was 1/6d (RPI £2.75) including tea and cakes for the Welcome Home Fund.

In March 1955, 63 happy Sunday School children had tea and cakes and watched a Charlie Chapin film in the Village Hall.

March 1965 began with extremely cold winter weather with six inches of snow and ended in summerlike heat.
