1. Respective responsibilities of the body and the auditor

This authority is responsible for ensuring that its financial management is adequate and effective and that it has a sound system of internal control. The authority prepares as Annual Governance and Accountability Return in accordance with *Proper Practices* which:

- summarises the accounting records for the year ended 31 March 2019; and
- confirms and provides assurance on those matters that are relevant to our duties and responsibilities as external auditors.

Our responsibility is to review Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return in the accordance with guidance issued by the National Audit Office (NAO) on behalf of the Controller and Auditor General (see note below). Our work **does not** constitute an audit carried out in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland) and **does not** provide the same level of assurance that such an audit would do.

2. External auditor report 2018/19

(Except for the matter reported below)* on the basis of our review of Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Government and Accountability Return. In our opinion the information in Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return is in accordance with the Proper Practices and no other matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

It has been identified through our review of reserves held at the year end and the internal auditor's 'No' response to Assertion D in the Annual Internal Audit Report that an effective budget system has not been in place in recent years which is contrary to proper practices. As a result the Council was using its reserves which were falling to a critical level. This process has now been addressed and the Council has improved its budgetary procedures but the Council has answered 'Yes' to boxed 1 and 2 of Section 1 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return which does not reflect the position in the year.

Although the previous clerk performed a risk assessment review in the year, the findings were not presented to the Council and so it has not been formally reviewed and minuted in the period. As such the Council has not properly considered risk as required and therefore should have answered 'No' to box 5 in Section 1 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return. We note however that this is being addressed post year end.

Other matters not affecting our opinion which we draw to the attention of the authority:

The risk assessment performed identified several areas of improvement required. We are satisfied that the new clerk is taking forward and addressing risk procedures but expect these to be fully considered and changes adopted where necessary by the end of the 2019/20 year.
